Start by contacting the Suburban Cook Call Center at 877-426-6515. This service can connect you to shelters, financial assistance, etc.

In general, many shelters in Suburban Cook County operate or are affiliated with **day centers** where **intakes** for emergency shelter are completed.

## Suburban Emergency Housing Resources

- 1458 Chicago Ave, Evanston, IL 60201 (Only for single men and women)
- 2121 Dewey Ave, Evanston, IL 60201 (Only for families, housed individuals and those with physical disabilities)
- Open Monday-Friday 9-11am; Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday 12:00-2:00pm; walkins welcome (Note: days and times heard on the pre-recorded phone system may be outdated)
- Offers Showers, Case Management, Bag Lunches, Clothing Closet, Laundry, Lockers, Food Pantry
- The Margarita Inn: Transitional Living Facility
  - There is a waitlist. Individuals must complete intake with a Case Manager, complete 4-5 visits with case manager after the intake, and continue to stay in contact at least once a month to keep the case active in order to learn about openings.
  - Available to: Single individuals and families (as well as those with disabilities)

    - Service area includes: Arlington Heights, Barrington, Barrington Hills, Bartlett, Bensenville, Buffalo Grove, Deerfield, Deer Park, Des Plaines, East Dundee, Elk Grove Village, Glencoe, Glenview, Golf, Hanover Park, Hoffman Estates, Inverness, Kenilworth, Lincolnwood, Morton Grove, Mount Prospect, Niles, Northbrook, Northfield, Palatine, Park Ridge, Prospect Heights, Rolling Meadows, Roselle, Rosemont, Schaumburg, Streamwood, South Barrington, Skokie, Wilmette, Winnetka, Barrington Township, Elk Grove Township, Hanover Township, Maine Township, New Trier Township, Niles Township, Northfield Township, Palatine Township, Schaumburg Township, & Wheeling Township

    - Intakes are done in-person at the Hope Day Center above (You will need the most recent address where you were living at least 30 days, must be in the service area. Additionally a background check required for shelter and will be done in real time)
    - Runs from October 1st to April 30th each year
    - Clients are allowed on site between 7:00pm-7:00am
